constitute ordain and Command that he the said Peter Baker be in all
things held treated reputed and esteemed as one of the faithful people of
us Our Heirs and Successors born within this our Province of Maryland
and likewise any Land Tenements Revenues Services and other Heredita-
ments whatsoever within our said Province of Maryland may Inherit or
otherwise Purchase receive take have hold buy or possess and then may occupy
and enjoy give sell alien and bequeath as likewise all Liberties and
Franchises of this our Province of Maryland freely quietly and
peaceably have and possess occupy and enjoy as any of our faithful
