against our peace, good rule and Government and contrary to the Form of the Act of Assembly in
such case made and provided whereof she the said Negro Slagar was convicted before the Hon-
ourable John Brown Esq. and others Justices of Queen Anne County Court at one the Twenty-
third day of August in the Year of our Lord One Thousand seven hundred and Seventy three
Nevertheless We grant unto her the said Negro Slagar our firm Peace and wills not that
she suffer any corporal punishment therefor but that she shall stand and be in the same
slight and conditions to all intents and purposes whatsoever as if the said Felony whereof
she the said Negro Slagar hath been convicted had never been done or committed. Witness
our Trusty and well beloved Robert Eden Esq. Lieutenant General and Chief Governour in
and over our said Province this 22^d day of September in the third Year of our Dominion

also in receiving examining and passing all Inventories and Accounts
whatsoever before you to be exhibited and at the suit or Instance of any
Person or Persons having or pretending to have any Interest in any
Deceased's Estate within this Province to proceed (Judge) Sentence
