Know Ye that of our especial Grace we have pardoned unto Jacob Stalland
late of Fredericks County Labourer, as a proper object of our Mercy, the Suit of our Peace
and whatsoever appertaineth unto us for that by the said Jacob Stalland did felon-
iously Steal take and lead away of black Stallions the property of a certain
James Ray of the said County whereof by the said Jacob Stalland was convicted
before the Worshipful Joseph Wood Esquire and others Justices of Fredericks
County Court on the sixteenth day of November in the Year of our Lord One
Thousand Seven hundred and Seventy three; Nevertheless we grant unto
him our firm Peace and will not that he suffer any Corporal Punishment
therefor but that he shall stand and abide in the same plight and condition
as to all intents and purposes whatsoever as if the said Felony whereof by
the said Jacob Stalland hath been convicted had never been done or committed.

Chief Governor in and over our said Province this 3^d day of December in the
