

and whatsoever appertaineth unto us for that he the said John Garvey on the fourth day of November in the Year of our Lord One Thousand seven hundred and seventy three between the Hours of Ten and Twelve in the Night of the same day with Force and Arms and forth at Baltimore County aforesaid and within the Jurisdiction of the same County Court the Dwelling House of a certain Samuel Burless then and there situated then and there feloniously and Burglariously did break and enter with an intent the Goods and Chattels of the said Samuel Burless in the said Dwelling House then and there being then and there feloniously and Burglariously to Steal take and carry away against our Peace Good Rule and Government whereof he was Convict before the Worshipful Thomas Franklin Esquire and others Justices of Baltimore County Court On the Monday before the first Tuesday in November in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand seven hundred and seventy three Nevertheless we grant unto him our firm peace and will not that he suffer any Corporal Punishment therefore provided that he the said John Garvey Transport himself or cause himself to be Transported out of this our Province within Twenty Days from the time of his Releasement out of Goal and never to return again otherwise this our Pardon shall and is hereby declared to be void and of none Effect any thing herein contained to the contrary in any wise notwithstanding - Witness Our Trusty and well beloved Robert Eden Esq<sup>r</sup> Lieutenant General and Chief Governor in and over our said Province this third day of December in the third year of our Dominion Anno Domini 1773. - Signed by Order *Wescott Clk Genl*
