

within the Jurisdiction of the same County Court on the said Twenty third day of September did instantly die, and that the said Enoch McDonald and Rebecca his Wife her the said Charity Stobbs in manner and form aforesaid feloniously wilfully and of their malice aforesaid did kill and murder against our Peace good rule and Government whereof they the said Enoch McDonald and Rebecca his Wife have been convicted before the Worshipful John Hoale Esq. and others Justices of Baltimore County Court at on the Tuesday before the Monday preceding the first Tuesday in October in the Year of our Lord One Thousand seven hundred and seventy four, Nevertheless We grant unto them our firm Peace and with out that they suffer any corporal Punishment therefor but that they shall stand and be in the same plight and Condition to all intents and purposes whatsoever as if the said Murder whereof they the said Enoch McDonald and Rebecca his Wife have been convicted had never been done or committed. Witness our Trusty and well beloved Richard Lee Esq. President and Commander in Chief in and over our said Province this 10. day of October in the Fourth Year of our Dominion Anno Domini 1774. —

Know Ye that of our especial Grace we have pardoned unto Negro Jack late of Queen Anns County Labourer (the Slave of a certain James Bordley of the said County as a proper object of our Mercy the fruit of our Peace and whatsoever appertaineth unto us for that he the said Negro Jack on the Twenty first day of May in the Year of our Lord One Thousand seven hundred and seventy four at Queen Anns County aforesaid and within the Jurisdiction of the same Court with Force and Arms and to wit the Store House of a certain William Robinson not being contiguous to or used with any Mansion House) feloniously did break and enter and fifteen English halfpennies commonly called Lappers of the value of one Shilling Current Money, four Silk handkerchiefs of the value of five Shillings Current Money each of the said Handkerchiefs, two pair of Worsted Stockings of the value of two
