Know ye that of our especial Grace we have pardoned
unto William Vermillion late of Frederick County Labourer as a proper
object of our Mercy this suit of our peace and whatsoever appertained
unto us, for that he the said William Vermillion on the first Day of
November in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and
seventy four with force and Arms and so forth at Frederick County
aforesaid and within the Jurisdiction of the said County Court one
Helding of a Sorrell below of the price of nine pounds Sterling
the proper Hiding of a certain Thomas Sprigg Woolton then and there
being found then and there feloniously stole took and led away
against our peace Goodwill and Government and contrary to the Act
of Assembly in such Case made and provided whereof he the said
William Vermillion was convicted before the Worshipful Thomas
Crisp Esq^r and other Justices of Frederick County Court aforesaid
on Tuesday the fiftenth Day of November in the Year of our Lord
one thousand seven hundred and seventy four; and for that he the
said William Vermillion on the said first Day of November in the
Year aforesaid with force and Arms and so forth at the County aforesaid
and within the Jurisdiction of the said County Court one Hiding of a
Sorrell,
