Maryland 1st The Right Honourable Henry Starford Esq^{ue} Absolute
Rob^t Eden Lord and Proprietary of the Province of Maryland
Sir -

All our. Baillifs and good People to whom these presents shall come Greeting,

I know by that of our especial grace we have pardoned unto Edward
Murphy of Baltimore County Labourer as a proper object of our Mercy the
suit of our peace and whatsoever appertaineth unto us for that he said Edward
Murphy on the seventeenth day of July in the Year of our Lord one thousand
seven hundred and seventy four between the Hours of eleven and twelve in the
Night of the same day with force and arms and so forth at Baltimore County
aforesaid and within the Jurisdiction of the same County Court the Dwelling
House of one Henry Sheeff feloniously and Bunglariously did break and
enter and lwo pair of brown Thread Stockings of the Value of sixty four pounds
of Tobacco of the Goods and Chattels of him the said Henry Sheeff in the same
Dwelling House thereto and there feloniously and Bunglariously did Steal
take and carry away against our peace & good Rule and Government whereof
he the said Edward Murphy was convicted before the Worshipful Jonathan
Cowman Esq^{ue} and others Justices of Baltimore County Court aforesaid
on the Tuesday before the Monday preceding the first Tuesday in October
in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy four. Never-
theless we grant unto him the said Edward Murphy our firm peace and
will not that he suffer any corporal punishment therefore but that he shall
stand and be in the same plight and condition to all intents and purposes
whatsoever as if the said Felony had not been done or committed. Witness our trusty and
well beloved Robert Eden Esquire Lieutenant General and Chief Governor
in and over our said Province this 23^d day of February in the fourth year
of our Dominion anno Domini 1775. -
