All our Bailiffs and good People to whom these presents shall come Greeting
Know ye that of our especial Grace We have pardoned unto George Tully
Vallence late of Prince Georges County Labourer as a proper Object of our Mercy the suit of our
peace and whatsoever a spectameth unto us for that he the said George Tully Vallence on
the fifteenth day of January in the Year seventeen hundred and seventy five at Prince
Georges County aforesaid within the Jurisdiction of the said County Court one Proan
getting of the price of Twenty pounds Current Money of the Goods and Chattels of a
certain Peter Barnes then and there being found then and there feloniously stole took
and carried away against our peace Good Rule and Government and contrary to
the form of the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided whereof he the said
George Tully Vallence was convicted before the Worshipful Joshua Beall Esq^{ue} and
Others Justices of Prince Georges County aforesaid on the fourth Tuesday in March
in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy five Nevertheless
We Grant unto him the said George Tully Vallence our firm peace and Will not that he
suffer any corporal punishment therefor but that he shall stand and be in the same
plight and condition to all intents and purposes whatsoever as if the said Felony whereof
he the said George Tully Vallence hath been convicted had never been done or committed
Witness our trusty and well beloved Robert Eden Esq^{ue} Lieutenant General and Chief Governor in
and over our said Province of Maryland this 8th day of April in the fourth Year
of our Dominion Anno Domini 1775
