and fifty pounds of Bacon of the value of three pence Sterling Money of Great
Britain each pound of the said Bacon the proper Bacon and of the Goods and
Chattels of the said Benjamin Watters then and there in the said House
being found then and there feloniously did steal take and bear away
against our peace good Rule and Government and Contrary to the form
of the Act of Assembly in such Case made and provided whereof he the
said Negro Tom hath been convicted before the Worshipful Thomasas
Wright Esq^r and others Justices of Queen Anne County aforesaid on the
Fourth Tuesday in August anno Domini Seventeen hundred and
Seventy Five Nevertheless we grant unto him our full peace and
will not that he suffer any Corporal punishment therefor but that he shall
stand and be in the same flight and Condition to all intents and purposes
whatsoever as if the said Felony whereof he the said Negro Tom hath been
convict had never been done or committed witness our Trusty and well
beloved Robert Eden Esq^r Lieutenant General and Chief Governor and
over our said province this 21st day of December in the Fifth Year of our
Dominion anno Domini 1775.
