Upon Mr Emerys return from running the North Line I called a Council — the 12<sup>th</sup> Instant who came to the Resolution as inclosed. I have sent you also Mr Emerys Plea with his remarks & Observations He has laid down neither Sabages Bohemia or Elk River but in his Remarks says the North Line will not touch the Heads of any Rivers nor will the Circle round Newcastle as run by Mr Daker in 1732 affect the Head of the Bay or any of the Rivers as far as He is capable of judging & supposes that a due North Line will take in Warwick Town & be a Secant of the Circle & not a Tangent. but Opinions You see of a few I am afraid inaccurate Observations are the best Guides We as yet have & I see no probability but of remaining still in the Dark
