The Excell: having been pleased to signify to the Board his Ldp pleasure that We should give our sense of what Terms might be reasonable for an agreement between Himself & the Proprietary of Pennsylvania in the Settlement of the respective Limits & Bounds of their two Provinces: And several Plans & Observations being laid before the We are of opinion that so much uncertainty appears at present as well with respect to the Heads of Rivers running into Chesapeak Bay as to the Circle of Newcastle & the Latitude of the most northern Bend of Potomack River that We would not presume to advise any particular Boundary unless a due North Line could be run from the Middle of such an East & West Line as may be agreed on between the Proprietaries of the Peninsula & also a due South Radius run from the Centre of the Circle of Newcastle & the Latitude of the most Northern Bend of Potomack be taken by Observation.
