

the Original Tract with Licence to include, any adjacent Vacancy
 in their Parvey; but there are I find by strict Enquiry among
 the inhabitants many Gent^r. who hold large Tracts of Land &
 Surplus under extensive old Patents, who never will resurvey the
 same upon the Conditions that are at present insisted on by
 the agent before the grants Warrant of Resurvey; who requires
 on such Occasions the Arrearage for such Surplus from the
 Date of the Patent: but if His Ldp would permit the Patentee
 to have Warrant of Resurvey for his Land, upon Condition
 he shall pay for the Surplus henceforward at the original re-
 served Rent, there are none, hardly in possession of Surplus land
 I am well informed but would immediately take out warrant
 of Resurvey. This would be an immediate & perpetual increase
 of His Ldps Revenue from Quit Rents & I submit to your
 Consideration whether it would not be much for his Ldps Advan-
 tage: as it would also make pretty well known what Vacancy
 there is in each County. I have hinted my Opinion heron
 to Col^r Lloyd & desired he will against our next Meeting
 consider of it that we may be then able to write more
 particularly on this Matter.

Sir You will be pleased, herewith to receive, 4 Bills of
