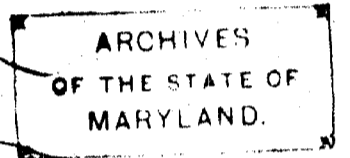

Copy of a Letter to His L<sup>dy</sup> dated the 2<sup>d</sup> of Sept: 1754  
My Lord.

As nothing worthy Notice has occurred in the short  
time that has elapsed since I lately had the honour of writing  
to your L<sup>dy</sup> but every thing both in & on the Frontiers  
of your L<sup>dy</sup> Province in the same Situation they then  
were I have not any thing to trouble your L<sup>dy</sup> with at  
present but a Request that your L<sup>dy</sup> will be pleased  
to accept of a Pipe of Madeira wine herewith sent from  
your L<sup>dy</sup> m<sup>o</sup> obliged & m<sup>o</sup> devoted Servant.

So herewith you will be pleased to receive Duplicates  
of all the Laws which were passed in the two Sessions of

of all the Laws being twelve in Number which were enacted  
in the last Session at Annapolis concluded the 25<sup>th</sup> of July
