Copy of a Letter to Lord Baltimore Dated the 27th March
My Lord

Upon the Receipt of Your Lordship's Instructions dated the 22^d
of August y^e Colo. Taster's Acceptance of Mr. Calvert's Deputation to him
as Secretary I appointed Mr. Bordley to succeed Mr. Taster as Naval
Officer of this Post & Mr. Darnall as Your L^{ty}'s Attorney Gen^l. At
the same time I communicated to Mr. Darnall the Part of Your
L^{ty}'s Instructions that related to him, in answer to which I received
the inclosed Lett^r. I gave Col^o. Loyd in writing a Power &
Order to dismiss Mr. Edw^d. Tilghman from Your L^{ty}'s Service as
soon as he had sett^d Accounts with him; & taken out of his hands all
Books & Papers that relate to Your L^{ty}'s Rents of which Mr. Tilghman
had the Possession. When Colonel Loyd advises me of Mr. Tilghman's
Dismissal I shall unless I can be first honoured with Your L^{ty}'s
further Instructions thereon appoint either Mr. Goldsborough
or Col^o. Henry to keep the Eastern & Shore Rent Roll, Col^o.
Loyd having absolutely refused to accept it in lieu of that
