Copy of 6th Letter to Mr Calvert dated the 24. March 1757.

Sir As I am obliged to wait on Lord Loudoun this Morning
& am afraid that I shall scarcely find time before I leave this
place to write you a long Letter I take the Liberty to send you
a Copy of one that I inclose to His Lordship whence you
will learn what Steps are taking here, & what His Ld^{ship} has
given us in Charge. I shall set off for Annapolis to Morrow
that I may be able to get thither by the Day that I have
appointed to meet the Assembly. I do not know when His Ld^{ship}
will order the Embargo to be taken off but as soon as any
Vessels shall be permitted to sail I shall take Care to advise
you of my Success with the Assembly & of every other Occurrence
worthy your Notice

Copy of a Letter to Lord Baltimore dated the 29th of May. 1757.

My Ld In a Letter dated at Phila. the 23rd of March I told your
Lordship that I expected to meet the Assembly at Annapolis immedi-
ately on my Return thither, but as the Small Pox continued to
rage in this place, & as the Gentlemen were too much afraid of
that Distemper to venture where they were liable to Infection,
