My Lords

I do myself the honour to inform Your L^{ds} that having on the 26th of July received Your L^{ds} Letter dated the 13th of Nov^r last I forthwith issued a Proclamation in obedience to His Majesty's Commands communicated to me by Your L^{ds} Let^r. appointed the 7th of the present Month to be observed throughout this Province as a Day of Publick Thanksgiving for the many signal Blessings which it has pleased Almighty God to give to His Majesty's Kingdom by His L^{ds} during the course of the last Year which Day was accordingly observed by Myself His Majesty's said L^{ds} and the whole of the Province with such Solemnities as were usual on such great occasions

To the Right Honble The Lords of Trade. Ann^o. 10 April 1760

I have the honour to acknowledge the Letter You were pleased to send me on the 26th of last Month that the late Proceeding of your L^{ds} in relation to the said Letter that they will be prevailed on to grant any more Money for the said Service during the War that it has been my little Honour to think that we are intreated to discharge the Debt which was contracted on account of the said Service after the 5th of Oct^r 1759 and the Money which has been so far granted for that purpose accordingly advanced. The sum we have already advanced is to Yourself to be paid or not as you shall think fit in a Reimbursement of the said sum when you see the Summ^{er} when it is directed to answer the said Debt and I am very much obliged to you for the same.
