

I mean the late Genl. Bell Thooper is so deep in the Opposition,

ors at the Pleasure of His Lieut. Govr. which Opinion, was it to
prevail would probably be attended with ill Consequences & be the
cause of a Bill being brought into the Lower House to confine the
Judges of the Provincial Courts during good Behaviour which is the
form you know in England, & it is also established in some of the
Northern Colonies while the Justices of our Provincial Courts are liable
to be removed at pleasure: As to Mr Darnall he I think, must
be well disposed towards the Proprietary, I am sure he has great
Reason to be, having long enjoyed a very good Office which he
owes to the Bounty of His Ldp's Father: Neither Col: Tilghman's
Abilities nor his are remarkable, nor do they want Capacity. Mr Price
whom as he is Chief Justice I should have mentioned first, was as
I have been told appointed by Mr Ogle many Years ago to prevent
the Courts filling, there being not Magistrates enough present to
hold it to business. For point of Understanding I believe he is equal
to sitting on the Bench & suppose rather better acquainted with
