we received the agreeable News) to Congratulate Your L^{dy} on that very interest-
ing & happy Event which it is hoped will not only incline His Majesty's En-
emies to Peace but also lay them under a Necessity after a Peace shall be made

that Col: Tashet was dangerously ill, insomuch that I despaired of his Reco-
very: what was then apprehended with regard to him having now come to
pass for the Fever - under which he had languished these three Weeks
together with an inward Impostume carried him off last Night & deprived
this Community of a valuable Member I now take the Liberty to address
You once more on behalf of M^r: Bidout & to request it as a particular
Favour that You will appoint him Your Deputy in the stead of Col:
Tashet which I should not so earnestly desire was I not convinced that he
