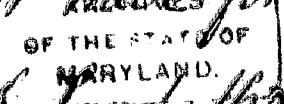


he shall think proper; so as that no Disturbances may be occasioned by the
 Receivers distraining on People who cannot be compelled to pay, for I must
 observe to your Ldp. that the Farmers of Worcester Somerset Dorchester
 & Quen Anns Counties in particular ^{have} for many Years past received Quit
 Rents for a great many Tracts of Land that lie on the North Side of the
 Line that was run from Fenwick's Island & on the East Side of the Tangent
 which is to be a Boundary. That Your Ldp. might see what Kind of
 Queries they were on which I thought it necessary to desire the Opinion of
 Lawyers, & what Opinions they have respectively given I shall transmit Co-
 pies thereof to be laid before Your Ldp. & if Your Ldp. shall think such a
 Step necessary to be laid before Council in Great Britain, as the greatest
 Part of Worcester Parish to which the Rev. Mr Dingle was Rector falls
 into Sussex County, so that the 30th poll arising due in the Remainder
 of it would not be a Subsistence for him Your Ldp. will I hope approve
 of my inducting him again into that of Thent Island or some other small
 Parish that may be without an Incumbent

Sir When I wrote to You the 20th of Oct. I gave You room to think that the
 Commissioners nominated by His Ldp. & those appointed by the Proprietors
 of Pennsylvania would meet at Newcastle on Delaware the 12th of Novem^r.
 & forthwith proceed to carry the Articles of Agreement into Execution, for
 Reasons however that You will see in the Narrative continued which
 I shall herewith transmit to You we did not meet there until the 10th of
 last Month. The next Day as the Minutes of their Proceedings (a Copy
 of which You now receive) will show You the Commissioners met viz^t on
 the part of His Ldp. myself, Col: Loyd, Col: Henry, Mr Bidout
 who
