Phila. to carry as it is said twelve Regiments from this Continent to Mar-
tinico towards the latter End of the Summer — with the utmost Respect

Sir Inclosed is a Petition that was presented to me a few Days ago (for the
Remission of a Forfeiture) which I must beg the favour of You to lay before
His Lop, all I can say of it is that I am satisfied of the Truth of what
is therein set forth & as the Parents of the Child which was killed were
most if not alone to blame, I hope His Lop will exercise his Clemency
towards the Young Man the Petitioner who upon giving Bond to His Lop
for the Value of his Cart & Horses hath the Use of them till His Lop's Plea-
sure can be known. I shall likewise herewith transmit a copy of the Minutes
of the Proceedings of the Commissioners for running the Divisional Line
at our two last Meetings whereby You will see that the Surveyors are to set
out next Month to proceed with their Line which is already continued up
the peninsula almost 26 Miles
