

In Council Annapolis 17<sup>th</sup> March 1778

that  
Lanamore Rummey who you brought hither as a Recruit says he has  
not made choice of the Regiment to serve in, and that he does not know  
that any of the others have made their election. Rummey seems rather  
inclined to serve in the fifth Regiment - Major Stevens who signed  
his Receipt for the Recruits, is not here. Adjutant Ledgeray says  
that the men were asked if they had any objection to serving in the  
second Regiment and that they had none. It may be necessary, in  
determining which Regiment these Recruits are to go into, to have  
well ascertained whether they did or did not agree to go into the  
second Regiment and we request your Affidavit of what passed; and to prevent  
any Dispute hereafter, you are to mention in the Enlistment what  
Regiment and Company the Recruits chose to serve in.

Infantry Annapolis 19<sup>th</sup> March 1773. —

121. Sirs  
Inclosed you will receive a letter which came under cover to the Governor from the War & Ordnance Office. The subject of your letter is mentioned in this. We have never been able yet to obtain an account of the Public Lead which was in the Baltimore Magazine or what of it remains. We wish you would make Inquiry and, if there now remains more than four Tons, receive one Half of it and send it forward, sending us a Receipt, on the Continental Account, unless any Quantity is to be purchased in Baltimore, and we hear there is ~~it~~ <sup>if there is</sup> it ought to be purchased for the Continent at once and ours kept for our own use, for we are so short in that Article, that we ordered a Purchase of a Ton or two ~~and~~ <sup>the</sup> Landward ~~the~~ <sup>the</sup> Sea Board at 5<sup>o</sup>.  
Col<sup>o</sup> Jas. Darkeill tells us that the Goods purchased by Col<sup>o</sup> Simpson, are coming by land, as well as ours, to Cambridge, and that it is by no Means adviseable to trust the Goods under your Direction below, by Water.
