them with Cloathing in like Manner as the other Recruits.

175. Sir The Assembly having by a Resolution of this Day, put the Recruits  
who may enter into Brigadier General Count Pulaski's Legion, on the  
same Footing as those raised for the Maryland Continental Regiments.  
On any of the Officers of that Legion lodging with you a Certificate  
from the Lieutenant of your County of his having passed a Recruit  
for that Service, enlisted in your County for three Years or during  
the War you are to pay the forty Dollars Bounty, allowed by  
this State, the twenty Dollars allowed by Congress, the Genl. who are  
on this recruiting Business will pay themselves, being provided for  
far by the Congress.

Sir

176. On Complaint from several Parts of the State, of the Price allowed for Provisi-  
ons being too low, the Assembly has thought proper to pass a Law containing the intellig  
(Case). It is impossible for us to ascertain the Prices, 'til Enquiry can be made into  
what is given by the Continental Purchasers; but this need occasion no Difficulty  
in the Execution of your Office, as you will be careful to keep an exact Account of the  
Provisions you collect and the estimated Weight of the live Cattle. The Addition  
may be easily made, according to what we may, on Enquiry, find to be just, and the  
People may be assured that we shall do what we can to place them on, and not  
beyond an Equality with those of our neighbouring States, who supply the  
Army with Provisions.
