You are to load the Molly with the Tobacco we find you, and that she may take as much as can be put into her, break from off the Sh. and flow in between the whole Dogheads. After you are loaded and properly cleared, you are to proceed to St. Peters in Martime and there deliver your Largo to Mr. Richard Garrison, to whom you go consigned, and whose further Orders you are to observe. We shall write him on the Subject. If you should be forced into any other Island or Port by Accident or the Enemy, you are to stay there and write to Mr. Garrison, advising him of it and inclosing him a copy of this Instruction, he will, on Receipt of it, give Orders, which you will follow. You will advise us by every Opportunity, of your Situation and Proceedings.

Sir. By this Day's Post we received yours of the 4th. We shall consider and advise you of the Persons we may think will assist you in your Office with Integrity and Industry. We have derived no Assistance from the Recommendation of Congress of the 25th of April, to the Government of Pennsylvania, to furnish Sailors for manning the Maryland and Virginia Gallies: a due Attention to it would much forward the Transportation of the Provisions purchased. A good Deal of Meat, especially Bacon, has been bought up in this State, we wish it to be removed as soon as may be, for immediate Use, and shall do all we can to accomplish it, for, besides its being wanted, it will not keep in collected Quantities, unless there's more than common Attention to it.

We believe it will be a safe conveyance and could have wished a agreeable to the other Purchasers, that the Whole might have come hither together or that they should have been brought by Land no farther than Cambridge and there they might have been easily divided and from thence they might have been readily sent to Baltimore or the Head of the Bay. What is for theantinent might have been readily made into Skirts & Overalls at Baltimore. The increased Expence and what is more considerable, the great Delay from sending the Goods to Lancaster and afterwards bringing them back induce us still to endeavour to get our Proportion up by Water.
