

Annapolis 10th Sept: 1770.

In June last, Mr. Thomas Leon was sent from this State to Philadelphia; he
N. 312. had been an Officer in the British Service and came out of Philadelphia; he said that
he had resigned his Commission and referred to several Gentlemen who had been
Prisoners in Philadelphia, to clear up the suspicions which were entertained
of him here. He was, undoubtedly, discharged by you, either generally or on Terms, and
has a Pass dated 1 July, from Lewis Nicola Town Major. Mr. Bradford
Commissioner of Prisoners told Capt. Campbell that Mr. Leon was set at Liberty
Paroll to appear when called on. Mr. Leon having returned hither and showing
a desire to go to the West Indies, the Council and I have enquired of him
whether he is not on Paroll, but he says that his Discharge was absolute
and that you were fully satisfied by Major Giles and others, that the
suspicions here entertained of him, were groundless. I shall be obliged to
you to inform me whether Mr. Leon's Discharge was absolute, or, if on
Terms, what those Terms are. —

In Council Annapolis 11th Sept: 1770.

Sir.

From the Information received by this Board, we entertain strong Suspicion Carr
that the Avarice and Fenerity of Individuals will prevent the voluntary Effect ty
of the late Act prohibiting the Exportation of Provisions, unless the Officers
313. of Government are vigilant in their Duty. It belongs to your Department
in a particular Manner, to be active in enforcing the Observance of Laws
respecting our Trade, and we request your Attention in a particular
Manner, to prevent Breaches of the above mentioned Act. It will be
well to desire the Captains of Vessels, at the Time of their Clearing, to give
in an Account of their Provisions for the Voyage and, if the Quantity
appears to you necessary, give a Provision Bill; this Method will
prevent the Exportation of Quantities for Sale, under Pretence of their
being for the Use of the Vessel, and secure the fair Traders from the
bad Consequences of a Difference in Opinion as to what may be
necessary for the Voyage. —
