as to write us on the Subject of Cloathing for our Troops, and also
whether you can place Money at Camp, for the Indistment of the
Drafts &c. It is very disagreeable and inconvenient for the Post
to go out always in a few Hours after his coming in; the same
Man is employed to ride from Philadelphia to this Place,
we wish you to have it altered. Jonathan Parker would ride
to and from Baltimore and, if he received the Mail in any
reasonable Time in Baltimore, would come to this Place on
Thursday Night.
