Public Powder, under an Assertion that Major Smith desired it to wait of he was not just going off for Annapolis, have given him a written Order. From several Circumstances we are induced to believe that Mr. Gerrocks has behaved with very great Impropriety & we request that, unless the Powder is immediately returned on Capt. Keppel's Demand at the Value paid to his Satisfaction, that you'll bring Suit for the State against Mr. Gerrocks.

Sir. We received yours of the 20th Novemt and 5th Inst. We would have you engage without Delay at £10. a Hundred for good Pork. We send to Rock-Hall, from whence we hope you can easily get them, four Barrels of excellent Salt. We have Stuff to make Barrels, but have not been able to get Workmen yet, we would have no Delay for your or our Difficulties on that Account, get the Pork fatted well away in Bulk and, if you can not get furnished with proper Barrels, will send our own Boats and remove it loose.

Be so obliging as to write us from Time to Time, the Quantity you have and what you expect.
