348. Sir: We enclose you a Copy of the Resolutions of our Assembly, agreeable to a  
Acquisition contained in them. One of the Gallies destined for the Expedition  
carries 2 - 10 Pounders, 2 Twelves, 2 Sixes & 2 fours; the other 2 Eighteens & 12 fives  
they have together about 50 Men and ought to have, at least 160. Fearing  
the Encouragement offered by the Assembly may not have the desired Effect,  
we have requested Congress, if they have Men who can be turned over to this  
Service, to send the deficient Number. It is much our Wish that your  
Gallies and ours could proceed in Company to Charles Town, but, unless  
Congress can assist in manning ours, we think there's little Chance of it.

Congress communicated nothing more to the Executive of this State  
than what is contained in the Resolutions. - We shall give you the  
earliest Information of any Change of Prospect -
