Council Annapolis 25th Decr^r 1770.

We just now received your Letter of the 22^d. There cannot be a Vendue or Sale of it, we wish you to sell it as fast as you can, at private Sale. The
Matter of an Allowance for your keeping an Horse, was mentioned long since
to the Council and it was then thought we could not, with Propriety, make
it and we believe you were either verbally or by letter so informed and further
that the Governor and Council wished you to state your claim to the
Assembly who alone can properly make such Allowances, without
a previous Provision --

Sir

We inclose you a copy of our Letter of the 10th of last Month and also
of the Resolution and Clause of the Act of Assembly mentioned to be sent
therewith. Immediately after writing our former Letter, the Weather
sat in so severe that all Intercourse with the Head of the Bay was
stopped, which prevented our sending the Blankets and other Articles of
Cloathing, as we intended, they shall however be sent as soon as
they can with any prospect of getting them forward. We send Lieut.
Gale with twenty eight thousand Pounds to be delivered to Maj^r Howard
in Baltimore where we hear he and several other Officers and Men are
who came down as an Escort to the Convention Troops, expecting
that he will take charge of and deliver it to you, 20,000 £ of which,
we have sent for the Purpose of your issuing 150 £ to each Officer
agreeable to the Resolution of the Assembly and the other £ 1000, to
pay the forty Dollars Bounty to each of the nine Months Men
as have enlisted or may enlist, agreeable to the Act.

We shall be obliged to you for a due acknowledging the Receipt
of this and the Money; we have paid the £ 150 to Capt^t Thomas
Landsdale of the 1st and Lieuts James Bruff and John Smith of the 6th
