nity has presented. — We have also directed 100 Pair of Shacs and 100
Pair of Stockings to be sent you for your Men, which we expect
you'll receive about the Time of your receiving this; we could not
furnish Shirts, &c.

We this Morning received yours of the 3^d Inst. and inclose you an
Order on your Treasurer for £1000. We are glad to hear that you
357. have been so successful in your Purchase. What you ^{have} agreed for, if
the 30,000. should come in as you expect, we take cheerfully, but as
the Quantity we have will be fully sufficient, we would not have
you extend your Purchase farther. The Difficulty of getting Barrels
is so great with us, that we can give you no Assistance in that
Article. We shall send you a further Quantity of Salt, as soon
as we can, but if it should not reach you by the Time you want
it, Supply yourself by all Means if you can.
