Gent. The above is a copy of the Resolution of the 13th of December last of the General
Assembly. The Accounts of all Expenses of the Civil and Military Establishments
of this State being kept by you, it is in your Power only to make the best
and most particular Estimate of them. We, therefore request you will furnish
us, as soon as it can well be done, with the actual Expense of the Year
1778 under the Heads of, The Civil Establishment, The Marine, the Matroos
and the Militia, and of general Charges, which may not be Standing Expenses
but occasional, or any other more particular Heads, as you find convenient and
think proper, remarking and adding the further Allowance, if any made, for the
Year 1779. We are very desirous of being so exact and particular as to afford
the Satisfaction desired —
