Sir.

The Copy of the Indistment you inclosed us will not answer our Design, we want, if necessary, to lay before the Assembly, the Indistments of the Men now in the Maltross Company at Baltimore, we therefore request you will send us the Original Indistments by the first safe Hand. Sergeant Cornwells Confinement was for your Safety as well as to prevent such atrocious Behaviour from others and it was, if we remember right, under an Idea that the State Regulations had not provided for the Case; the Continental Regulations, if introduced since the Commission of the Offence, cannot govern in the Measure of Punishment yet if you think the Sergeant may with Safety to yourself and without any bad Effects from the Example, be set at Liberty, we have no Objection; perhaps you may exchange him with some of the Officers, so as to obtain those Ends and if you can you are at Liberty to do so. We think it will be your best Way to pay Murphy's Fees and take him back, deducting out of his Pay, as it becomes due and if there should be any Loss that the Public ought to bear it. You had best get the blue Cloth as soon as may be, it will probably not be cheaper than £ 4<sup>0</sup> 10<sup>0</sup> 0. We see that the Soldiers are fed with Beef at 3<sup>0</sup> 1/2<sup>0</sup> we have a good Deal of Pork at Edward Dorsey's Mr Judah was desired in July or August and several Times since to get it down and if in Part, do urge it down, the Pork will otherwise be, if not already, entirely lost.
