By Capt. Shepards Return the 10<sup>th</sup> March, there were then remaining  
1599 Musquets, 732 Cartridges, 3132 Musquet Cartridges, we do not know  
of any delivered out since, except a few Musquets & Cartridges to the  
Marines who went down in the Languegar and which were to be  
returned, we flattered ourselves that a much greater Proportion  
were in good Order. About a twelvemonth ago, we sent a good  
many Arms to the Head of Elk to guard the Stores there, very few  
have been returned. By Sol. Dumseys Return 3<sup>rd</sup> May there was in  
the Hands of Mr. John Barnaly at the Head of Elk "25 Boxes & a  
few loose Arms, am<sup>t</sup>: 500 Stand, 100 of which have not Bayonets, 300  
"gun slings, 500 Cartouch Boxes & 250 Cartridges"; we inclose you an Order  
and wish you to send for them; we would send ourselves, but it is  
not in our Power. if you send, let it be by a Man in whom you  
can confide for his Prudence as well as other good Qualities, and  
direct him to be cautious. We shall be obliged to you to put Things  
in such a Way that the Cartridges wanted maybe made up & in such  
a Manner as to be suitable; we indeed have no Body that we  
can send Orders to, <sup>in this Matter, Capt. Shepards having declined to</sup> act for the Salary we could allow him, but from  
every Thing that has past, we believe, he is not only very capable of  
conducting that Business, but that, on such an Occasion, he would cheer-  
fully do every Thing in his Power to promote it.

Gent. We have not had any certain late Intelligence from Virginia; the same  
Express which carried Letters to Congress, brought Letters from Gen<sup>l</sup>. Henry  
dated 11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> Ins<sup>t</sup>. which gave us the same Information, doubtless, that  
he communicated to Congress. We have not been, however, without several  
flying Reports, how far they can be depended on, we do not know; if  
the most probable are true, they have 2 Indian Brigades & a Number  
of Tories & Refugees, commanded by Mifflin, they have burnt Port-  
mouth & Suffolk & were on their Way to South Quay, they have got a  
great Number of Negroes & have behaved with great Cruelty. It is  
conjectured in Virginia that they design to visit this Place & Balt<sup>o</sup>.  
as soon as the Work is done or they <sup>are</sup> draw off in Virginia. We imagine  
the Head of Elk is as much an Object as either Balt<sup>o</sup>. or Annapolis
