

In Council Annapolis 9th July 1779

Sir: The Dolphin returns to you with what you wrote for, except the double broad
shot, which could not be got, at least in the quantity desired. The Merchant
No 550. desirous that the gallies should stay down longer than the appointed time if
Vessels and the Health of your men will allow it and the men agree to it, we
be glad you would prolong your cruise, but you know the promises we gave, which
we would by no means break for a temporary advantage.
Cannons are you satisfied?

In Council Annapolis 9th July 1779

Sir: Your circular letter of the 22^d of May, in great measure, occasioned a call of our
Assembly which is to meet the 15th Inst. We have to regret that Congress did not earlier
make their requisition on the States to fill up their Regiments of Troops and that
nothing was not, we suppose could not be, sent with the Recruiting Officers. We
have not been altogether without success tho' it is much short of our Wishes.
Your Letter of the 28th May came to Hand only the 2^d Inst., inclosed is a confirmation
of the Officers who were the Subject & Occasion of it. There have been some few
applications to us for Appointments in the Maryland Line, such as from Recommendations
we were satisfied would do credit to it, we have qualified —

into Shirts and deliver for each Recruit a pair of Shoes, Overalls & a Shirt, taking Receipts
552. from the Officers. We are sorry that the Park turns out so bad, you must sell it for
the best you can, the smaller the Quantities, the better, to prevent Purchasers selling
again. We send an immediate Supply to Maj^g Smith
Capt^o Stechert.

Sir: We have drawn the Money for Capt^o Bailey & Mr. Holmane as you desire and have written to
Mr. Hepple to have the Oynal made up into Shirts & the Clothing delivered. If Clothing can be
sent to you from the continental stores, it would greatly facilitate the Recruiting Service and
in some measure prevent successful Desertion, we wish you would prep for 800, or 1000 more
Shirts, & Hats. Col^o Stans sent 15 Recruits, 2 deserted at Marlboro' and two were lost. His
Boat is cleaning, we hope to find the remaining Recruits off in her this Evening, we shall
553. shall call at Whitstone Point for yours, as you request. No Linen Coats to be
We wish to be furnished with a Roll^m of the Recruits and to which Regt they
belong, as far as they can be ascertained, in Order to lay before the Assembly
Col^o Uriah Bonest.
