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No 617. A great Deal besides Five Stores, but She may answer as a Convoy to any other Despatch you send with her. We suppose the Orders will be to deliver to the French Fleet if our Captain can get there Time enough, or if it should have passed, to proceed after it. Would it not be well to encourage private People to send Supplies and Refreshments on giving good Security to deliver their largesses and bring back Certificates, on your Recommendation, which I think ourselves justified in granting this Permit. The Supply to our Friends in any Measure you will recommend which may have that Effect. Would not it be well to send all the Slaves which can be got in Boat & Sail to Landings on Delaware to be sent from thence? The Congress might recommend & we permit it, for we presume the French Fleet will make no long Stay short of New York and the less Navigation the Better. If you approve the Permit to private People on Security, immediately inform us, as perhaps we may, indeed, have to be shipped from Patowmack.

If you can procure them soon, purchase as far as 1000 Pairs not to exceed twenty five Dollars. Any Number of Stockings that you can purchase, not exceeding 2000 Pairs we wish you to get, if strong & good, we shall not grumble at 10 or 10 Dollars, if the Quality deserves it, go as far as 20. perhaps you might get the more if you advertised that you were appointed to purchase Stockings & Shirting for the Maryland Troops and request a Preference, same People yet amongst us would surely willingly give it. We send by this, or shall by the first Opportunity £15,000. writers of the Receipt of it and frequently of your Success; do push the Business our poor Fellow very much want Shirts. If you have more Linen by you than you can immediately make up, please to send it to Mr. Muir with Thread that it may be made up here and Mr. Randall, who waits for it, may be the sooner discharged.
