Circular

Gentlemen.

The general Assembly reporting the most entire Confidence in your Integrity,
Patriotic Zeal and Attachment to the common cause, have appointed you Commissioners
for — County, to carry into Execution the Act for the immediate Supply
of Flour and other Provisions for the Army. The enclosed Copy of His Excellency
General Washington's Letter, manifests, in the strongest Terms, the great Difficulties
of the Army, and the urgent Necessity of your most vigorous Exertions to
procure and forward a sufficient Supply of Flour and the other Articles enumera-
ted in the Act. Your own Discernment is sufficient to point out the manifold
Evils that would result from so calamitous an Event as the Disbanding the
Army, and will suggest to you that the Happiness of yourselves and Country, may
depend on your Diligence and Activity in executing the Law, and your Endeavours
to dispossess the People of your County, not only to acquiesce in, but further the
Measures of the General Assembly in attaining so desirable an Object as the
immediate Supply of our Army with Flour and other Necessaries. You may
rely on our Assistance to remove every Obstacle that might impede, or render
a full and speedy Execution of this Law difficult. The Copy, herewith sent, is
sufficient, without particular Instructions from us, to direct you how the
Business entrusted to your care and Management, is to be conducted. We expect
you will make Returns to us, every fortnight, of the Quantity of Flour and other
Articles obtained in consequence of the Law. We advise you, in granting Certificates
to confirm the Ease and Conveniences of the Person entitled, by giving Certificate
for small sums, if required. The Copy of the General's Letter is sent as the
most authentic and indisputable Proof of the Truth of the Grounds of the Law
merely for your Information and not to be communicated to any Person,
unless you think it will facilitate the Execution of the Law in particular
Cases and induce a more cheerful Compliance. We have enclosed your
Certificates and a few Copies of the Proclamation.
