We have determined to release the Prisoner, on his giving Bond with good and sufficient Surety, in the Sum of twenty thousand Pounds, to make his personal Appearance before the Executive of the State of Delaware within twenty Days after the Date of such Bond, and on complying with the Terms specified in the Bond herewith sent, the Blanks of which Bond we request you will fill up and legally executed previous to giving a Discharge, and transmitting the Bond to James Woolford Esq^r Sheriff Dorchester County
