Sir In Order to judge of the Quantity of Provision forwarded, under the Law for an immediate Supply of Flour &c., it will be necessary to know what you have received and from whom; not only from the Commissioners, but from the Continental Purchasers. We have some of your Returns, but they are not complete. Let us hear from you immediately on this Subject.

270. Sir We received your Favor of the 16th and have laid it, with the Resolutions of your Excellency and Council, before the General Assembly. We are sensible that your Design in laying the Embargo, may be frustrated, unless a similar Resolution is adopted by this State; and therefore we should not have hesitated, in the Decree of the Assembly, to have imposed such a Resolution as would have prevented the Evil suggested in your Letter.
