Sir,

No. 53 We have an Offer from Mr. Wallace and Davidson of the Sloop Parus to go down the Bay against some of the numerous Vessels that are committing Depredations on the Property of the Inhabitants of this State on our furnishing her with Provisions Stores, we shall be obliged to you to deliver to Mr. Stephen Steward such Provisions as he may apply for for the use of the said Vessel.

Sir,

Mrs<sup>r</sup> Wallace and Davidson have so far as they are interested in the Parus, offered her to this Board, for the Purpose of going down the Bay a few Days, in Pursuit of two small Privateers now committing Depredations on the Inhabitants near the Mouth of Choptank River.

No. 54 We hope your Consent may not be withheld as it is probable these Pickaroons may be captured with Ease by a Vessel of her Force, if speedily and secretly fitted out for the Purpose; Should you agree to lend her on this Occasion. We beg of you to exert yourself to the utmost in procuring Men and Stores for the Expedition at the Expence of the State. We are fully of Opinion with Mrs<sup>r</sup> Wallace and Davidson that it would be good Policy to give the Prizes to the Officers and Men, and would hereby engage to obtain a Resolution of the General Assembly to relinquish the Claims which the State might have in their Favor. General Gish or in his absence the Officer commanding in Baltimore will furnish thirty Soldiers upon Delivery of the enclosed Letter, to act as Marines on Board the Parus and Mr. Falkoun will furnish Mr. Danoller and Captain Keefots will furnish the necessary Provisions Arms Ammunition &c.
