the Demands for furnishing our Army and pressing, we rely on  
your exertions to procure the articles ordered for that Purpose,  
and that you will dispatch the Vessels before any Expence of  
Demurrage is incurred, you will either diminish or increase the  
articles mentioned in the Scheme according to the Subjects in  
Hand, holding in Idea that the Soldiers floating are the most  
necessary.
