We believe they have executed the Duties of the Office with Fidelity. It was not in their Power to answer fully the Purposes of their appointment because we could not supply them with Money and the People would not sell their Property for Certificates.

We send you by this Opportunity Bushels of Salt, and if a further Quantity is necessary we will send it on Notice, unless you can purchase it in your neighbourhood on reasonable Terms, perhaps it may be proper to procure a small Quantity of Allum Salt at any rate to mix with what we send, tho' the quality of it is very good being about four Years old. We are sorry to find you have not a Prospect of feeding to Mr. Murdoch more than 15 or 20 Head of cattle on the Hoof. We have been informed that some might be procured in the upper Parts of Montgomery County in the neighbourhoods of Mr. Smith, we request you to enquire & add to forward all you can and as speedily as possible. You will receive by \_\_\_\_\_ of the new Commission, the Exchange we estimate at present for continental money to be from 85 to 90.
