Sir, You will receive from Captain Berry one six Pound Cannon with Carriages, fifty Musquets and Accoutrements, one hundred 129. Cannon Cartridges, one hundred round ^{six} Pound Shot, and thirty Pound Musquet Powder, for the use of the Militia of St. Mary's County. They are to be delivered to Richard Barnes Esq. or in his Absence to the commanding Officer of the County to be applied in such manner as he may direct and think most necessary for the Protection of the Inhabitants.
