147 Sir, Enclosed you have a Resolution of the General Assembly respecting your Command to march to Truro as a Guard over the Convent Troops. It is our wish that you march there as soon as you possibly can, as the Troops under the Command of Col. Crocket at present as a Guard over the Convent Troops are ordered to Fort Pitt, Colonel Maltree.

148 Sir, Agreeably to the Act to compel the Payment of the Taxes in Somerset County. We request you to order immediately a Company of Militia from your County of one hundred Privates under a spirited Officer to march into Poolehock and Annemobie Hundreds in Somerset County and be there stationed until the public Taxes due in those Hundreds are collected or until they are relieved for the Purpose of aiding the Collectors in the Collection of the public Taxes due in those Hundreds.
