Sir. We have enclosed you a copy of the Act of Assembly to compel the  
154. Payment of the public Taxes in Somerset County, and for your Support  
in the Execution of your Office, the Company of Militia ordered from  
Dorchester County will be stationed agreeable to the Act and ready with  
any of the militia the Lieutenant of Somerset County may think proper to  
add to that Service (should necessity require it) to enforce the Payment  
thereof. We have no Doubt but you will use every Means in your  
Power to make the just Collection, as the exigencies of the State  
requires your utmost Assistance.

In Council, 7<sup>th</sup> Feb. 1781.

Sir. We receive your Letter of the 22<sup>d</sup> ult and are much obliged to you  
for your assistance and activity in preserving the Cargo of the Slave  
155. General Smith informs us that he hired Negroes to save the Fall  
Cargo, and that the whole of that Cargo except what was purchased  
by some of the Inhabitants, is lodged in Mr. Billwoods Yards. This  
Board have determined to have the Slave transported to Baltimore  
Town to be baked or repack'd and have appointed you to take Care of  
the Interest of the State and have the whole of the Slave as well the Fall  
as the Slave Cargo put on Board the Craft we have sent down,  
and will make you ample Compensation for your Trouble and Care in  
superintending and managing this Business. We are willing to make  
the militia the usual and customary Allowance for Salvage (which is  
one tenth part of the property saved) and will pay one tenth Part to you  
or your Order to be distributed among those who assisted you. We request  
you would use your Endeavours to find out Persons who have embezzled  
our Slave and transmogrified their Names to us as soon as possible  
that we have them prosecuted. If the Craft sent will not carry  
the whole of the Slave, be pleased to procure a Vessel immediately  
Since writing, the above Craft Shepherd have arrived with four hundred and
