 will well and faithfully perform the several Duties required of me
 by Law without any Partiality Fraud and Deceit" Your Bond
 and Securities are liable for the Payment of one Pound in every
 hundred Pounds of Property by you sold at Auction and you
 are once in every three months to account on Oath and pay the
 same to the Treasurer of your Shire. Your Allowance as Auctioneer
 is as follows for house hold Goods fattle or live Stock 3 pence
 per Horse 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ for Ships or other Vessels Horses or Land & Pounds,
 for Goods Leaves and Merchandise 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ Pounds, for Negroes one pence
 with a Power to appoint a Deputy Auctioneer.
