transporting the Cannon, Stores and Baggage from Sea Ships and most of the Craft
belonging to the Bay have been impressed to transport the Detachments from Elk to the
place on their way down, and a very numerous Expence incurred on that account and
at: 29d. by means of the Citizens of the State to facilitate the movement of the Troops. The
Transports now lie in Severn River, and will as well as the City and the public
Property in and about it be exposed to the Enemy, the State Boats now here being
too insconsiderable to make effectual resistance against the Tore in the power of the
Ships to land. We apprehend the Preservation of the Transports, the public Property,
the City and the Safety of the Citizens to be Objects of general as well as particular
concern to the State and therefore request you to order one hundred and fifty or
two hundred Men to this place for the Protection of the Inhabitants, the Transports
and the public Property. If it was necessary to suggest any further Reasons to induce
a Compliance with our requisition we should mention the disagreeable Situation
of the Citizens; the Small Pox is almost in every Family and will be very infectious in
a few Days and therefore if an attempt should be made by the Enemy, no Succour
~~could~~ be expected from the militia most of whom have not had it; This is not
the only Inconveniencie they must encounter if compelled to defend their Habitations,
they would have no place to fly to the fugitive people would avoid them as
much as they would the Enemy.

General Gist

In Council, 30 March, 1781.

Sir, We have enclosed the Commission you requested. We think that notwithstanding
standing your Returns to us of the Select Companies of Militia you may receive
others into the Companies so as they do not exceed the Numbers limited by Law.
Capt. Mountjoy Bailey of Frederick County is appointed to receive and provide
for the Recruits procured in your County, and in Frederick, you will be so
obliged as to send the Recruits furnished in Washington County to him.
The Recruits by the Law are not to be removed from the County until they are
provided with Cloathing allowed them, yet we suppose they ^{cannot} have any
objection, when we assure them they shall not be marched from the place of
Rendezvous until they receive their Cloathing. The Reasons of our ordering these
are that they may be better provided for and that they may be disciplined.
