Sir, Gentlemen, We think the Rampart Pines if they should be too numerous for the situation, will be very useful in the Gallion Barres and Raps of Defense to be built in this State, and request you to apply for Seven Hundred and fifty of the last, and as many of the last of the Fartidges Boxes as can be spared and four of the Brass Field's Pieces, and hope your utmost Endeavours will be exerted to obtain the field Pieces for they are much wanted.

No. 368. Yours of the 12th Instant we have received. There are so many calls in the States for Supplies of Provisions that we have been under the necessity of directing in many Parts of this State that the militia when called in Service should find themselves and make a Garage thereof, this has been the case with those acting as Hovemans, (and we hope the Company of Horse in Baltimore Town will readily agree to furnish themselves with Provision and Garage) to have a Quarter Master and Garage Master in every County for this purpose would create as expenses far beyond any advantages resulting from such a Service. It never was our intention that the militia of Baltimore Town should be put on guard to Patapsco Neck we have no to Genl. Buchanan on that Subject. whenever any Person is pointed out to us as dangerous and disaffected, it will be our Duty as well as our Inclination to exert the extraordinary Power with which we are invested for the Security of the State by taking such Steps as may be deemed necessary. we have wrote fully to Genl. Buchanan on this Subject to which we refer you. we wrote you yesterday to send Cromwell down under a sufficient and secure guard, which we request may be complied with. we have determined to charter Vessels for transporting Convⁿ to New York for the Payment of Debts contracted by our captive Officers agreeable to the Terms enclosed you.
