Sir, Many pressing and immediate Demands for Provisions and other
Reasons induce us to receive dead Beef from the Inhabitants of this
other Counties within the State, when the Detachment under the
387 command of the Marquis was in this City, we could not furnish
them with fresh Provisions without receiving Dead Beef and engaging
that it should be discounted for Taxes as Beef on the Hoof; we
therefore request you will give Directions to the Collector of An-
trim and County to receive in Discount for Taxes all Certificates
issued by John Cisal since the first Day of March last for dead
Beef, the same manner as if it had been delivered on the Hoof.
