394. Sir, Capt Duwall of Paines County, this Morn^g brought to Town
 five Prisoners of War lately captured in Charles County, and as the Men
 who compose the Guard have not had the Small Pox, we wish to have
 them immediately relieved from their Charge and Apprehensions,
 therefore request you the Favor of you to direct the Officer of the
 Guard in this City to receive them.

395. Sir, Yours of the 22^d Instant we have received and are much surpris'd
 to be informed of your admitting Grouse and Straues to bribe after receiving
 our Directions to have them sent under a sufficient Guard to this Place
 for Examination. (You will have them and all others under similar
 Circumstances immediately apprehended and sent down agreeable to
 our former Directions with their Papers, and all the Testimony
 against them that you can collect. We hope and expect you will
 make the most diligent Enquiries that these Peep^{le} may be discovered
 and brought to condign Punishment. We have not Time to determine
 on that Part of your letter respecting the Application of the cap-
 tured Flour, only that the Refusal ought to be sent to a Place of Safety.
 We are to some Time ago that we had directed M^r Shep^{erds} to
 deliver you two Kegs of musquet Powder which if received we ima-
 gined would be sufficient for the Militia of your County. We are
 desirous to contract for the building of a Galley and several Barges
 and wish to be inform'd on what Terms you could undertake
 this Business. We beg your Attention to all public Property
 in your County particularly Provisions of all kinds which must
 be deposited in Places of perfect Security.
