done him.

Sir, You will apply to Col Adams for the British Prisoners confined in
the public goal, and have them marched immediately to Frederick Town
under a guard to consist of one commanding Officer, one Sergeant and
431. Corporal and twenty Rank and File who to be delivered to Col G.
Thibaut (Thomas Lieutenant of Frederick County) to be by him forwarded
to Fort Frederick and put under the care of Col. H. Ross Hawling
Commander of the Fort. We hereby command and direct you to
impress as many horses as may be necessary to mount the Guard
ordered on this Service. You will order that particular attention
is paid to Matthew Morgan late Captain of the Jack. He
is represented to this Board as a Slave that has been par-
ticularly concerned in burning the houses of the inhabitants of his
State.
