In Council, 29th May, 1781.

By a Resolution of the general Assembly of this Day, it was
requested to order the publick wheat collected and remaining on Hand
in Loudon Kent Queen Anne Hertford Baltimore and Anne Arundel
N^o 476 Counties, and at Brices Lantfises and Ogles Mills in Frederick County
to be manufactured with all Dispatch into fine and superfine Flour
and to order immediate Returns to be made of all wheat and Flour
in those Counties. We request you to have the above Resolution carried
into Effect immediately in the Counties above mentioned within your
District, one half of the Flour to be manufactured into superfine,
the other half ~~taken~~ into fine Flour. You will make us immediate
regular Returns of all the wheat and Flour agreeably to the above Resolution.

You will immediately proceed down the Bay at least as
